

Chatterbox Deputy Team Leader

Chatterbox is the Norwich Talking Newspaper, a charity that has been producing weekly summaries of the Norwich Evening News for blind and visually impaired listeners every week for over 40 years. The charity is entirely run by volunteers, and many stay for a long time – currently our longest serving volunteer has been with us for 39 years.

There are four production teams, each responsible for producing the newspaper on a Thursday once every four weeks. Each team has a team leader who also edits the week's edition. Some team leaders are assisted by a deputy who takes over at around 5 p.m. on a Thursday (once every four weeks) and stays until the office closes. We will very soon need a new deputy team leader and are looking for either an existing or a new volunteer to take up the role.

Key Responsibilities

The deputy team leader:

- is “in charge” at the office on the recording day, from around 5 p.m. to about 8.00 p.m.
- supervises the work of other volunteers – generally very easy as most are highly experienced
- assists other volunteers as necessary
- closes the office at the end of the day

There are detailed guides to the roles of the deputy team leader and any interested candidate would be introduced to the role and trained as necessary.
